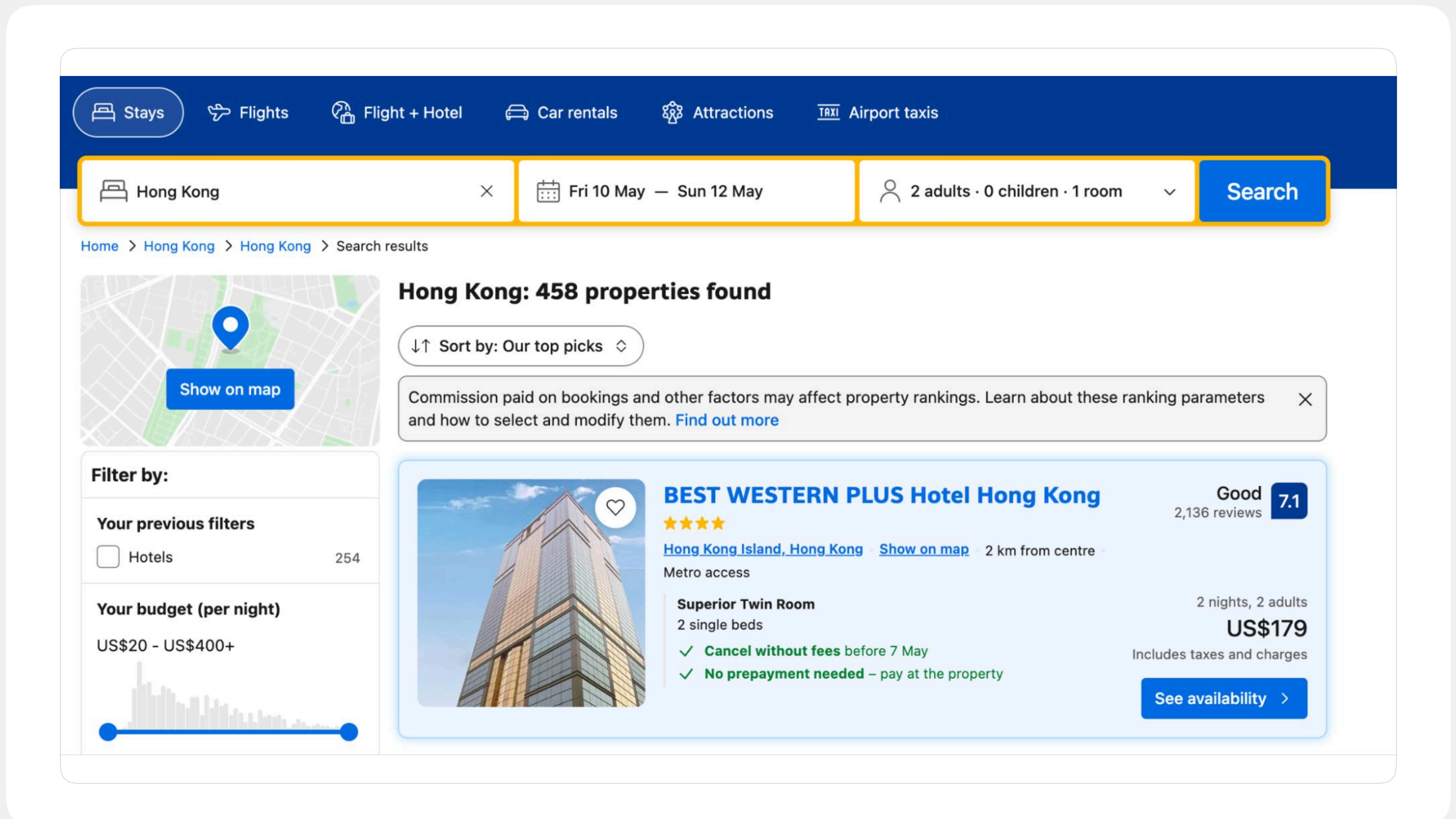

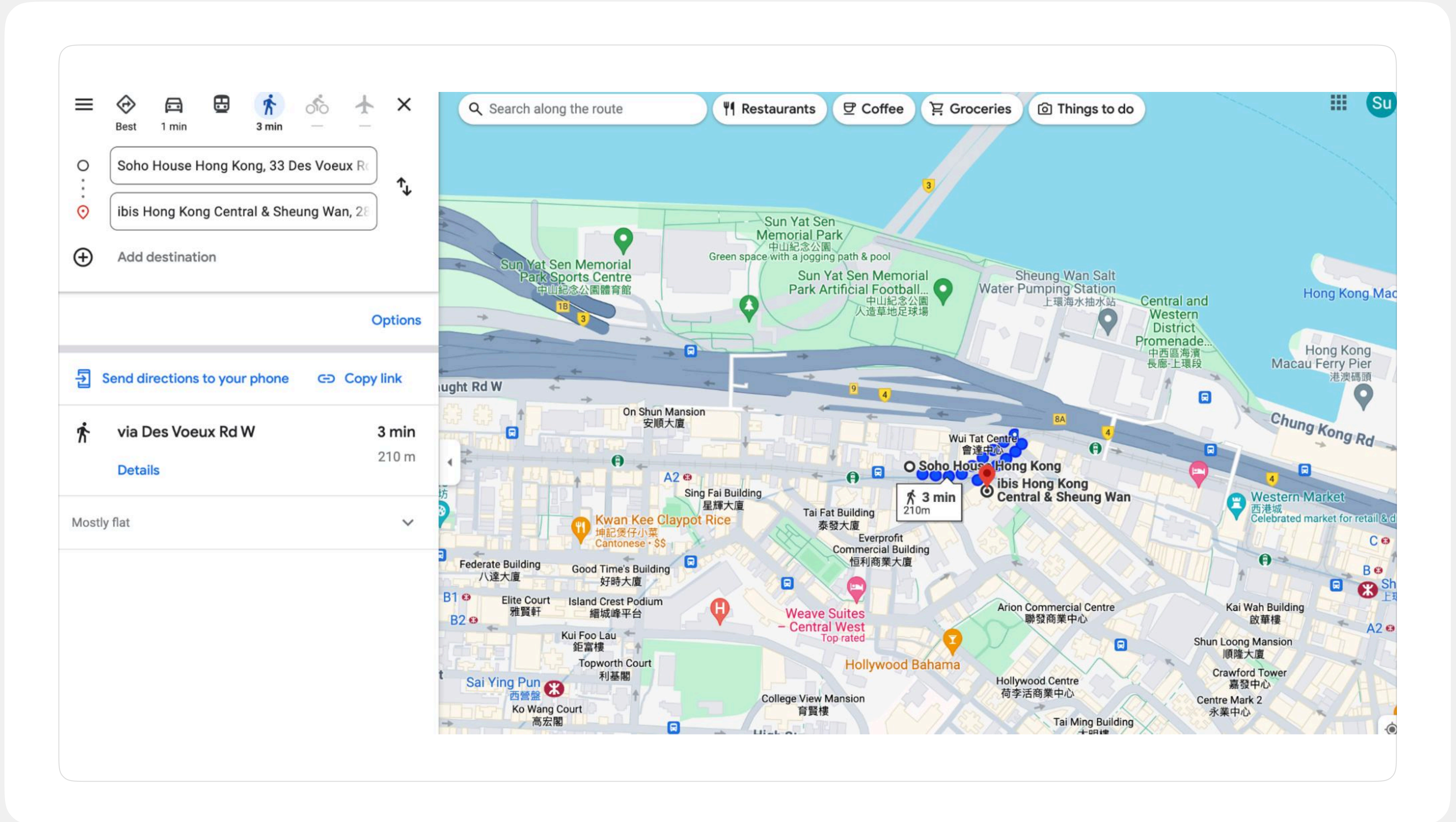

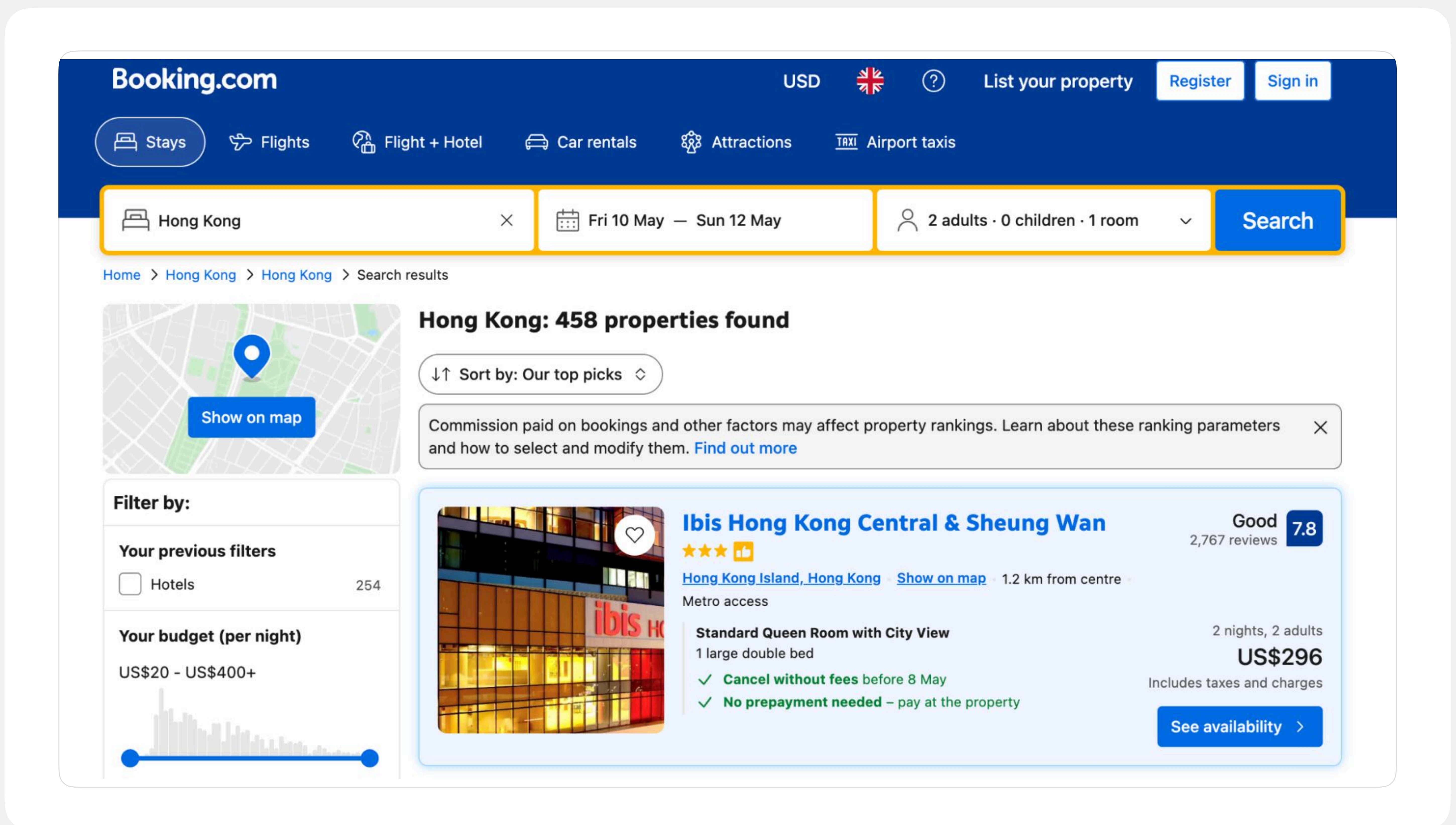

Tourist from Mainland China

If you're from mainland China, Alipay will basically be enough to get you around Hong Kong. If you are still worried, you can prepare some cash in HKD in advance.

Tourist from other countries

Public Transport Service: Octopus card

Octopus Card is a smart payment tool that allows you to pay cash-free for all major public transport services, as well as dining, entertainment, shopping and more.

There are two types of Octopus for visitors:

- Mobile Octopus: Download the Octopus App for Tourists to easily add Octopus to your iPhone or Huawei mobile phone. A refundable deposit of HK\$50 is required for Mobile Octopus.
- Tourist Octopus: Get a physical travel card starting from HK\$39 with no deposit required. It features an iconic Hong Kong design, making it a perfect souvenir that you can reuse when you return to Hong Kong in the future.

Taxi

Taxis in Hong Kong mainly accept cash. Some taxis accept electronic payments, such as Octopus, credit cards and Alipay.

If you want to have cashless experience, it is advisable to use Uber.

Language & Culture

Hong Kong is a multicultural city whose culture and language reflect its rich history and special geographical location. The official languages are Chinese (Cantonese and Mandarin) and English. Cantonese is the main language used in daily life among the people of Hong Kong, which not only includes traditional Cantonese but also incorporates some vocabulary and grammar from English, Japanese and other dialects. This unique linguistic phenomenon reflects the cultural inclusiveness and diversity of the people, as well as the characteristics as an international city.

In the 20th century, Hong Kong not only made significant progress in the economic fields, but also became one of the cultural centres of Asia. Hong Kong's film industry reached its peak in the 1970s and 1980s, when it became the second largest film production base in the world, and was known as the "Hollywood of the Orient", with martial arts, kung fu, and police procedural genres becoming representative of Hong Kong cinema. The works of film-people such as Wong Kar Wai, Stephen Chow and Bruce Lee enjoy a high international reputation, and their films are not only popular in Asia, but have also won the hearts of audiences around the world.

The prosperity of Hong Kong's film industry is not only a result of its commercial success, but also a reflection of its importance as a hub for cultural exchanges. As the highest honour for Hong Kong films, the Hong Kong Academy Awards attracts many renowned directors, actors and producers every year. This award is highly influential in the Chinese world.



Bruce Lee

Hong Kong's pop music industry rose rapidly in the late 20th century to become one of the most influential music centres in Asia. Hong Kong's pop music is a fusion of Chinese and Western musical elements, ranging from pop songs to rock, from electronic music to jazz, in a wide variety of styles, catering to the preferences of listeners of different ages and backgrounds, and has produced many outstanding singers and bands, such as Jacky Cheung, Beyond, and Eason Chan, among others.

Laws and Regulations

Do not use, carry or sell any drugs (including cannabis) in Hong Kong.

It is not allowed to bring electronic cigarettes into Hong Kong.

Sockets in Hong Kong are **British Standard**, so please prepare the conversion plugs in advance.

If you have any questions about the rules for bringing items into the city, please check the information in advance.

Web3 Policy

In January 2024, at the 17th Asian Financial Forum (AFF), Hong Kong's Chief Executive, Mr Lee Ka-chiu, said, "The Hong Kong SAR Government is committed to the development of green finance and Web3 ecosystems, and to seizing the opportunities for development."

This is more than a year since the Hong Kong government formally released a policy declaration on local crypto asset development in October 2022, and it is yet another time that the Hong Kong government has highlighted the important strategic role of Web3 development for the construction and development of Hong Kong's financial centre at an important international financial event.

Below are the specific measures taken by the Hong Kong Government in relation to Web3:

- 31 October 2022: The Hong Kong Government issued the "Policy Declaration on the Development of Virtual Assets in Hong Kong", announcing its support for the development of virtual assets.
- February 2023: The Hong Kong Government announced in the Budget that HK\$50 million would be allocated to support Web3 development.
- April 2023: The Hong Kong Web 3.0 Association was established.
- May 2023: The Hong Kong Securities and Futures Commission issued a consultation paper on "Licensing Regime for Virtual Asset Trading Platforms".
- January 2024: HKSAR Government is committed to the development of green finance and the Web3 ecosystem, as stated by HKSAR Chief Executive, Mr Lee Ka-chiu, at the Asian Financial Forum.

Hong Kong's Cyberport also set up a "Cyberport Web3 Base" in early 2023 and a HK\$400 million Cyberport Venture Capital Fund. Fintech start-ups are mostly small in size and often encounter difficulties in funding their development. Cyberport's core mission is to incubate and assist these start-ups by providing them with resources such as funding support, corporate advisory and co-operation platforms, as well as assistance in launching their products, expanding their markets and identifying investors, so as to cater for the needs of start-ups at different stages of their development. Start-ups can apply for investments ranging from HK\$100,000 to a maximum of HK\$1 million to HK\$20 million at Cyberport.

The positive attitude of the Hong Kong Government has been positively reacted by the Web3 industry. In recent years, more and more Web3 companies have chosen to set up branches or conduct business in Hong Kong. Hong Kong has become one of the major centres for global Web3 development.

APP

Travellers from Mainland China can purchase mobile traffic in Hong Kong in advance at Alipay.

Tourist Attractions

Hong Kong is an international metropolis and one of the world's major tourist destinations. It is rich in natural and human landscapes, ranging from bustling cityscapes to serene natural beauty. Here are 5 must-see attractions in Hong Kong, recommended for travellers planning to visit Hong Kong.

Victoria Peak

Victoria Peak is the highest point on Hong Kong Island, standing at 552 metres above sea level and offering a breathtaking view of Victoria Harbour. Visitors can choose to take the century-old Peak Tram to the top of the Peak or hike up the mountain. At the Peak, tourists can visit attractions such as the Peak Tower Observation Deck, Madame Tussauds Wax Museum and the Taiping Shan Restaurant.



Victoria Harbour

Victoria Harbour is one of Hong Kong's most famous attractions and one of the busiest harbours in the world. It separates Hong Kong Island from the Kowloon Peninsula, with high-rise buildings on both sides of the harbour and stunning views. Tourists can choose to take the Star Ferry to tour the Victoria Harbour and enjoy the stunning scenery on both sides of the harbour. Besides, they can also join the night tour of Victoria Harbour to enjoy the night view of Hong Kong.



Hong Kong Disneyland

Hong Kong Disneyland is one of the most popular theme parks in Asia, featuring several rides and shows themed on Disney characters and stories. The park is divided into seven themed areas, including Main Street USA, World of Adventure, Fantasyland, Tomorrowland, Toy Story Land, Grizzly Gulch and Mystic Manor.



Ocean Park

Ocean Park is another famous theme park in Hong Kong with over 1,000 species of marine life including sharks, dolphins and penguins. Visitors can experience a variety of exciting rides here.



Central

Central is the political, economic and cultural centre of Hong Kong and one of the busiest districts in the city, where the Asia-Pacific headquarters of many financial institutions are located. Visitors can visit landmarks such as the headquarters of the HKSAR Government, the Legislative Council Building and the HSBC Main Building, as well as browse through bar streets such as Lan Kwai Fong to experience Hong Kong's nightlife with some cyberpunk vibes.



Cuisine & Restaurants

Hong Kong cuisine is an important part of its culture, combining the flavours of Cantonese, Hakka and Teochew cuisines with Western influences to create a unique and diverse style.

One of the specialities of Hong Kong cuisine is "Dim Sum". Dim sum is a kind of exquisite snacks, with a wide variety of cooking methods, including steaming, dumpling, broiling, deep-frying, stir-frying and so on. Some common types of dim sum include shrimp dumplings, siu mai, barbecued pork buns, rice noodle rolls, turnip cakes, and so on.

Another speciality of Hong Kong cuisine is "street food". Food stalls can be found everywhere in Hong Kong, selling a variety of traditional snacks, such as egg custard, shark's fin, curry fish ball, stinky tofu, etc. The following is a non-exhaustive list of food stalls in Hong Kong.

Visit Cities in Mainland China

If you hold a passport from Germany, France, Italy, Netherlands, Spain, Malaysia, Switzerland, Ireland, Hungary, Austria, Belgium, Luxembourg, you can visit mainland China without a visa from 14 March 2024 to 30 November 2024, not exceeding 15 days. If you hold a passport from Thailand, Singapore, UAE, Serbia, etc., you can also enter mainland China without a visa. You can refer to [Wikipedia](#) for the specific applicable countries and duration of stay.

Why not take this opportunity to visit some other cities in mainland China by the way?

If you are interested, here are some useful tips.

Payment

The payment system in mainland China is quite different from other countries.

In mainland China, people are less likely to use cash and credit cards. Instead they use Alipay or WeChat to make payments by scanning QR codes.

You will need to download Alipay or WeChat, register and bind your bank account.

If you want to use Google, Facebook, WhatsApp, etc. in mainland China, you'd better connect a VPN before entering.

Snapshots of Mainland China Cities

Shenzhen

Shenzhen is very close to Hong Kong and is one of China's four super first-tier cities (Beijing, Shanghai, Guangzhou and Shenzhen). It is only about an hour's metro from Hong Kong. This close-by city is considered as the "Silicon Valley of China".

Shenzhen is renowned for its rapid economic development and innovative atmosphere. As one of the pioneering cities of Chinese economic reform, Shenzhen has transformed itself from a small fishing village to a modern, international city in just 40 years. Today, it is one of the richest and most dynamic cities in China, and one of the world's major centres of technological innovation.

Shenzhen is home to the headquarters of many tech companies, including world-renowned companies such as Tencent, Huawei and DJI. These companies have a huge global presence, and their technological innovations and business models drive the development of the technology industry in China and around the world.



Beijing

Beijing, as the capital and political, economic and cultural centre of China, has a long history and splendid culture. The city carries thousands of years of civilisation heritage and is one of the most important representatives of traditional Chinese culture.

Beijing is famous for its colourful historical landscapes. The Forbidden City, one of the most representative ancient buildings in Beijing, was the royal palace during the Ming and Qing dynasties and is one of the largest palace complexes in the world. In addition, the Great Wall, Summer Palace, Temple of Heaven and other historical sites are also not to be missed in Beijing.

Besides its rich historical and cultural heritage, Beijing is also a modern metropolis and it boasts a thriving cityscape and modern urban facilities. Scyscrapers, modern shopping malls, and international restaurants and entertainment venues fill every corner of the city.

Beijing is also a diverse city, attracting people from all over the country and even the world. There is a rich mix of cultures from different regions and nationalities, resulting in a colourful life and social scene. Whether it is the ancient hutong culture or the modern innovative technology, all of them reflect the characteristics of Beijing as a city with vitality and vigour.



Hangzhou

Hangzhou, known as "Paradise", is located in southeast China and is the capital city of Zhejiang Province.

Attractions such as the Lake Island, Leifeng Pagoda and Broken Bridge are scattered around the lake. In addition to the West Lake, Hangzhou's natural and humanistic landscapes include Lingyin Temple, Fa Xi Temple and Xixi National Wetland Park etc. Between these ancient temples, mountains and waters, they have gathered a thousand years of cultural heritage and humanistic feelings.

The Terracotta Army is the most representative attraction in Xi'an and is regarded as one of the Eight Wonders of the World. Giant Wild Goose Pagoda, Huaqing Pond, Mount Li and other historical sites are also unmissable attractions in Xi'an, showing the prosperity and splendour of ancient Xi'an.

The Ancient City Wall of Xi'an is one of the largest and best-preserved ancient city walls in China, and is the only existing complete ancient city wall, which is regarded as "the treasure in the history of ancient Chinese city architecture". The rich and colourful folk culture and traditional handicrafts also add a unique humanistic atmosphere and charm to Xi'an.

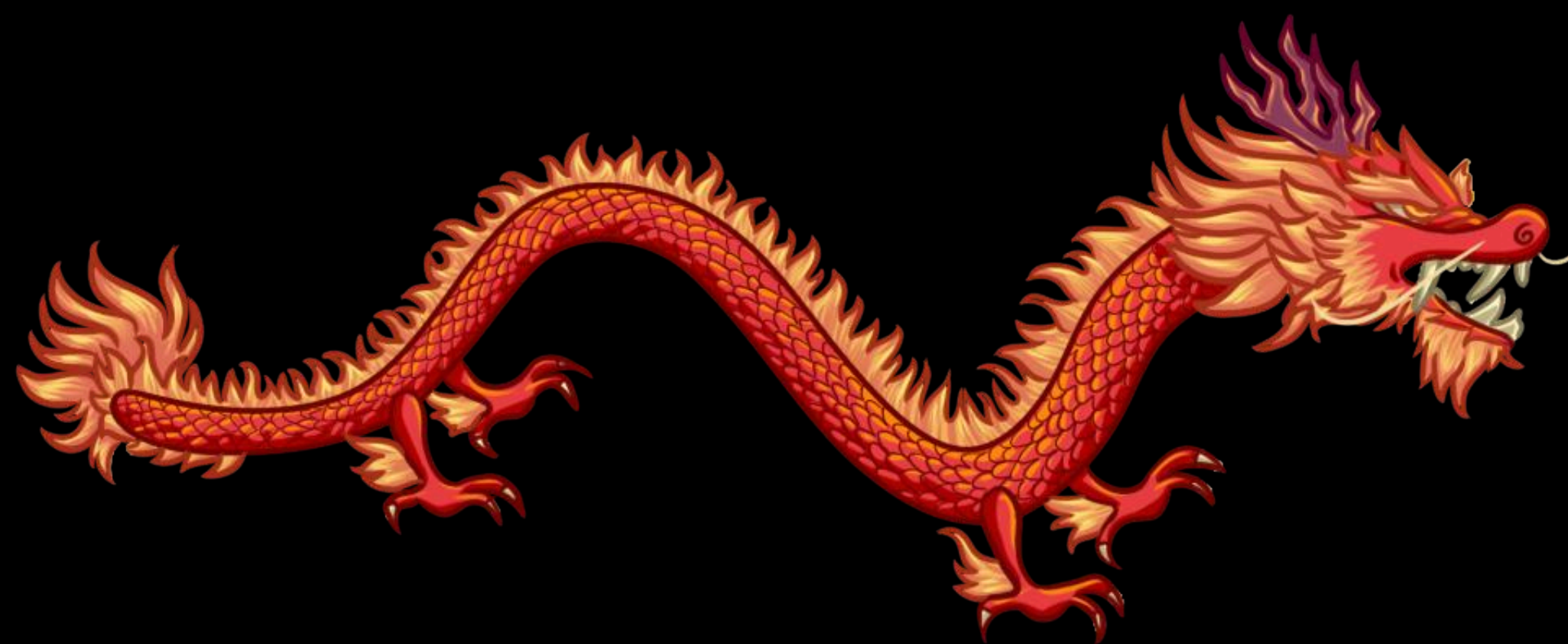


Ending
